If you own a convertible and a hardtop to go along with it, you should seriously consider using a hoist or lift to mount and remove the top. Here are a few reasons to choose a hoist over a dolly, cart, or cradle...

Our design is easier to use compared to other hoists--there is no cumbersome strap-to-'unthread' from under the top after it's been lowered, or to 'rethread' in order to remove the overall procedure is simpler. This simplicity allows you to mount or remove the weather when it presents, itself, or to give your car added hardtop protection when needed.
